

2016 National Retriever Championship
General Information for all Competitors, Visitors, and Campers

CAMPING

1. It is important to reserve a campsite in advance if you wish to camp in our campground. Contact Charlene Couch couch.i.c@sasktel.net
2. Assigned campsites will be marked on each site. As well, there is a master list in the Clubhouse if you wish to check where to park your trailer.
3. The campground is very full, so electrical power usage must be limited to water pumps, refrigerators, lights and small electronic devices. NO electric hot water heaters, air conditioners or toasters. Whenever possible use propane. Be considerate of your fellow campers.
4. Water will be available in a water trailer, and trailers can be topped up as needed during the event if you purchase a blue ribbon (\$20). We cannot guarantee that this water is potable, so we recommend you bring your own water for drinking. We ask that everyone **arrive at the campground with water tanks full**, as we will not have enough water on-hand to fill multiple trailers. Water fills are available at the Grasswood Esso South of Saskatoon on Highway 11 and the Flying J just North of Saskatoon on Highway 11/12.
5. The Saskatoon Retriever Club has arranged for trailer pumpouts on Tuesday September 20 and Friday September 23rd. If you need this service, please purchase a YELLOW ribbon at the Banquet or at the Bar for any of our events and tie it to your front hitch. The pumpout service has suggested that on the day of the pumpout you open the dump valve on the toilet and prop it open so that the suction does not collapse your holding tank. The Saskatoon Retriever Club and the pumpout contractor will not be held responsible for any damage that might occur.
6. Camping fees are \$10/night for this special event. There is a blue box in the Clubhouse with envelopes to pay your fees. Please write your name on the envelope so that we know you paid. Thank you.

GENERAL

1. All vehicles must be parked WEST of the tree line in the Parking and Airing area or NORTH of the overflow campground (North of the road leaving the campground). No vehicles should be parked in the Clubhouse/Campground area or East of the Clubhouse.
2. Dogs should be aired in the designated area WEST of the campground. If your dog has an accident in the Clubhouse/Camping area, please clean it up. Also fill in any holes that your dog may dig. Do not tie dogs to trees as this may damage the trees.

3. All garbage is to be packaged in securely closed plastic bags (available in the Clubhouse) and placed in the Loraas disposal bin located on the West side of the Club grounds by the big Equipment shed. No loose garbage please.

4. Training birds are to be disposed of in the metal garbage cans provided near the Loraas bin (marked). Under NO CIRCUMSTANCES should birds be disposed of in the Loraas bin.

5. Please recycle all cans and bottles. Place empty recyclables in the appropriate containers on the porch of the Clubhouse. Please remove all tops.

6. When driving, please stay on designated trails and only park where directed by the traffic committee. Do not drive or train on any of the neighboring properties unless the property has been designated as a Pre-Trial Training site (see maps in the Clubhouse) and has been marked as such.

7. Callbacks will be posted in the Clubhouse and announced as soon as they are available after each test. The next test will also be posted as will any special instructions from the judges.

8. Members of the media, landowners and the general public may stop by and observe the trial. Please be friendly, explain what is happening, and help them to avoid interfering with the tests or any working dogs.
